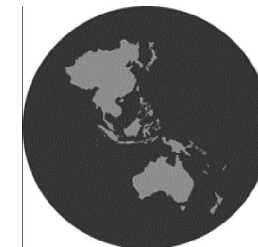

## A Look at the AUSFTA two years on

You are invited to a lunchtime seminar for activists, academics, journalists, community organisations, unions and interested members of the public to explore the impacts of the Australia/US Free Trade Agreement two years since the deal was ratified.

The aims of the seminar are:

- \* To facilitate discussion, analysis and strategic networking between community organisations, academics and campaigners working on issues relevant to the AUSFTA.

- \* To provide a forum to report on the emerging impacts of the AUSFTA in specific areas.

- \* To discuss and identify opportunities for collaboration and campaigning on the AUSFTA.



AFTINET campaigned against the AUSFTA because the US government identified important Australian health, cultural and economic policies they wished to change as a result of the deal. This campaign resulted in some successes however the agreement was signed and came in to force on 1st January 2005.

Since then figures show that Australia is worse off with the deal and that Australia's trade deficit with the US has actually increased. The FTA has also meant changes to Australia's health system, copyright law and media content.

This seminar aims to look further into these issues two years on, when the real effects are able to be more clearly seen.
